Anelle B. Primm, M.D., MPH is a partner of Health Disparities Solutions, LLC. She currently serves as Director of Minority and National Affairs for the American Psychiatric Association and is an Associate Professor of Psychiatry at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. From 1993 until 2004, she served as the medical director of the Johns Hopkins Community Psychiatry Program, a community mental health center, where she has developed and overseen a variety of mental health services for adults.

Dr. Primm is a graduate of Harvard-Radcliffe College and Howard University College of Medicine. She completed her residency in Psychiatry, fellowship in Social and Community Psychiatry, and Masters of Public Health degree at Johns Hopkins. A board certified psychiatrist, Dr. Primm maintains a small private practice in Baltimore, Maryland.

Dr. Primm is a nationally recognized expert on cultural issues in psychiatry and co-occurring psychiatric illness and substance abuse and has written and lectured widely on these topics. She has produced two educational videotapes, *Black and Blue: Depression in the African American Community* and *Gray and Blue: Depression in Older Adults*. Dr. Primm has been a leader in collaborative public educational outreach and mental health screening initiatives focused on medically underserved populations. She is a Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association, a member of the American College of Psychiatrists, and currently serves as Vice President of the American Association of Community Psychiatrists. Dr. Primm is Vice President for Public Education of the Mental Health Association of Maryland, an affiliate of the National Mental Health Association. She has received numerous awards and honors, including the 1993 Johns Hopkins Hospital Martin Luther King, Jr. Award for Community Service, the 2000 Distinguished Black Marylanders Award, the 2001 Maryland Schizophrenia Service Award and the 2003 Career Communications, Inc. Women of Color in Science and Technology Emerald Award for Medical Education.
